OPEN FORUM

A member of the public passed around pictures of a fly tipping incident in Ducky Lane. The rubbish had been dumped. It was agreed that this would be reported to Cornwall Councils Waste team for investigation.

A member of the public spoke about the issues of parking on Church St. Several lorries had damaged a residents wall which had been reported to Cllr J.Foot CC and Cormac. After some discussion, the Chairman responded in saying that all solutions would be taken on board and discussed with Cllr J.Foot CC.

7. Village Playground

The Chairman reported that the playground wall had been repaired, and it had opened after being closed for two weeks. Some shackles on the cargo net had been replaced.

8. Village Street Cleaning

The Chairman reported that some graffiti had been sprayed on a wall in School Rd on Cornwall Housing property. P.Lamerton had removed it and covered the remains with white paint. P.Lamerton had also removed the overgrown vegetation around the footbridge.

9. Climate Change: update from working group.

The Landulph Parish Council Climate Change 'Statement of Intent' was discussed as something that Landrake with St.Erney Parish Council might wish to adopt. It was agreed that this would be passed to the climate change youth working group to adapt for this Parish.

10. Cornwall Gateway Community Network Panel: update

G.Francis reported that at the last panel meeting the Police announced that next year they would be getting 47 additional officers across Devon & Cornwall, then another 95 the following year. It was hoped that would equate to extra capacity for Saltash and the surrounding area.

The Community Network Highways Scheme had an underspend for year 4 of nearly £20,000. It was suggested that any outstanding highway requests be put forward.

At the Panel meeting it was asked if Parish Councils could give their view on the future of 'Localism' in Cornwall. It was agreed that this would be added as an agenda item for the next Parish Council meeting.

11. Church Street Parking issues

J.Foot CC was brought up to speed on the discussions around this topic in the open forum. J.Foot CC was asked to enquire with Cormac if they would have any leaflets or letters that can be issued to houses along Church St. to make them aware of the parking issues and damage caused from lorries due to inappropriate parking. J Foot CC would report back.

12. To consider a street name for the Memorial Hall

After discussion it was decided to defer this item until the Annual Parish meeting to get more resident input.

13. St.John Ambulance donation request

After discussion it was decided to defer this item until the March meeting.
