A resident raised the issue of a cottage on school road that had built up a false wall that was causing parking issues. Cllr J.Foot CC said he would raise this with highways and investigate.

3. Approval of the Minutes of the Parish Council Meeting held on July 24th 2018

D.Foote asked that the minutes from the last meeting include the voting record for the planning item 16.1, in which there were 5 in favour and 3 abstentions for the application. M.Gingell raised the issue from the previous meeting that the overhanging vegetation near the footbridge needs cutting, but there was some uncertainty over who's responsibility it was.
